

TORINO AIRPORT, THE MOST EXTENSIVE SUMMER SEASON EVER BEGINS: RECORD NUMBER OF COUNTRIES, DESTINATIONS, AND SEATS ON SALE

*For summer 2026, 700,000 additional seats are on sale across the entire network,
which now connects Turin with 24 countries*

New international destinations: Budapest, Helsinki, London Luton, and Sofia

Caselle Torinese, 28 March 2026 – Starting on Sunday, March 29, 2026, Torino Airport launches its summer season, which stands out as the most extensive ever, with an unprecedented range of flights in terms of the variety of destinations, the number of countries served, and the number of seats available. This is an extraordinary opportunity for travelers, who will be able to take advantage of an international network that has never been so extensive.

The summer offering reaches record numbers: **53 destinations** (up 6% compared to summer 2025) make up the seasonal network, for a total of **24 connected countries** (with 3 new additions compared to 2025: **Finland, Hungary, and Bulgaria**), thereby strengthening the airport's international focus and providing new opportunities for business and tourism. Overall, 700,000 additional seats will be available in summer 2026 across the entire network compared to the 2025 summer season.

Among the main highlights is the debut of **Finnair**, a new airline for Turin, introducing direct flights to **Helsinki** starting 3 May. The new route enhances access to Northern Europe and, thanks to the Finnish hub, offers new connections to Asia and North America—an added value for passengers choosing Torino Airport as their starting point to reach destinations worldwide.

The network also sees an expansion of **Ryanair**'s service, which strengthens its presence with new direct flights to **Sofia** and **Tirana** and increases capacity on several existing routes, supported by the third aircraft based in Turin since November 2025. Enhancements include international routes such as Madrid, Malaga and Marrakech, as well as domestic destinations including Catania, Palermo, Lamezia Terme and Reggio Calabria—offering more frequencies and more seats to meet growing demand for high-potential tourist destinations.

Turin will also see a significant expansion of **Wizz Air** in summer 2026: the airline will launch new flights to **London Luton**, served for the first time also during the summer season, and **Palermo**, alongside **Budapest** and **Chisinau**, which will continue to be served from the winter season. The number of seats available on existing routes to destinations such as Catania, Bucharest, and Tirana will also increase.

Aeroitalia will operate flights to **Foggia** and **Salerno** this summer, and will also introduce a new route to **Comiso**.

Summer 2026 thus shapes up as a season of strong expansion and further improvements in Torino Airport's flight offering, both in terms of available days and schedules, reinforcing the airport's role as a strategic infrastructure for the region—for both inbound and outbound travel.

Among the numerous options, many Mediterranean beach destinations are easily reachable via direct flights from Turin to Olbia, Cagliari, Alghero, Catania, Palermo, Trapani, Bari, Brindisi, Naples, and Lamezia Terme in Italy, as well as to Malta, Corfu, Ibiza, Malaga, and Valencia in Europe. There is also a very wide range of options for those who prefer European cities, such as Barcelona, Porto, Stockholm, Copenhagen, or Vilnius. For passengers heading to more distant destinations, Torino Airport offers multiple daily connections to the main European hubs, including Rome, Amsterdam, Frankfurt, Munich, Madrid, and Paris Charles de Gaulle, as well as Istanbul, Turkey, and the new addition, Helsinki, thereby ensuring access to the entire world through convenient connections and attractive fares.

Andrea Andorno, CEO of Torino Airport, commented: “The 2026 summer season promises to be the most extensive ever, and this is a source of great satisfaction for us. After exceeding 5 million passengers in 2025, the expansion of our network, the increase in flight frequencies, and the offering of 700,000 additional seats on the market demonstrate the effectiveness of the work we have carried out in collaboration with the airlines. The addition of Finnair and the launch of the Helsinki route represent a particularly significant step, as they structurally strengthen the airport’s international connectivity. Furthermore, Ryanair’s third aircraft based at the airport and Wizz Air’s strong growth confirm the airport’s appeal and the soundness of our development strategy, which is focused on ensuring connectivity, competitiveness, and new growth opportunities for the entire regional system. The expansion of our offering also allows travellers to benefit from excellent combinations of savings and convenience”.
