

**TORINO AIRPORT: ALL-TIME TRAFFIC RECORD IN MARCH
WITH OVER 500,000 PASSENGERS; 115,000 PASSENGERS EXPECTED DURING
EASTER WEEK, UP 20% FROM 2025**

The first three months of 2026 closed with record results, driven by peak winter traffic and a very positive snow season. In March, the 500,000-passenger mark was surpassed for the first time April is expected to see another boost thanks to the Easter holidays.

Caselle Torinese, 2 April 2026 – A strong start to the year for Torino Airport, which recorded record traffic in the first quarter of 2026 and is preparing for a further surge during the Easter holiday week. **From January to March 2026**, the airport recorded a total of 1,426,300 passengers, an increase of **15.6%** compared to the same period in 2025.

March 2026 surpassed the 500,000-passenger mark for the first time, reaching **518,999 passengers (+15.6% vs March 2025)** and becoming the best month ever recorded. January and February were also record months, growing by **+16.5%** and **+14.3%** year-on-year, with an overall increase of **+15.4%** for the two-month period—well above the national average (**+4.9%**).

The growth during the quarter was driven primarily by **international traffic**, thanks to the extensive winter network, which featured the launch of new routes and increased frequencies to many destinations already served. In the first three months of 2026, international traffic grew by **17%**, while the domestic segment increased by **14%**. The quarter's performance confirms a traffic mix that is increasingly focused on foreign markets, with inbound flows related to mountain destinations playing a significant role.

The contribution of **snow-related traffic**, comprising both scheduled and charter flights carrying skiers to the mountains of the Northwest, was decisive: the 2025/2026 winter season closed with **404,512 passengers**, an increase of **21.9%** compared to the previous season. As usual, this segment was driven by the **United Kingdom** and **Ireland**, with other markets experiencing strong growth, such as **Denmark** (+36.9%), **Belgium** (+51.4%), and **Sweden** (+3.8%).

Ahead of the Easter holidays, Torino Airport is preparing to handle exceptional traffic: more than **115,000 passengers** are expected during Easter week, representing an estimated **20%** increase compared to the same Easter period last year.

As for outgoing destinations, the regions of **Southern Italy** and the **islands** remain, as always, popular choices for vacations and family reunions. **Major European cities** – including London, Paris, and Madrid – and destinations such as Marrakech and Copenhagen will be popular choices for leisure travel, with particularly strong performance also seen for **new additions to the summer network, such as Budapest, Sofia, and Tirana.**



On the inbound side, passenger flows to Turin will follow the trends seen in the first few months of the year, with a strong presence from **Spain, Denmark, and Ireland**.
