

WIZZ AIR BRINGS FOUR NEW ROUTES TO TURIN FROM POLAND AND THE CZECH REPUBLIC

From 16 January 2027, flights every Saturday from Wroclaw, Gdansk, Katowice and Prague to the key airport for skiers heading to the mountains of Piedmont.

Caselle Torinese, 2 July 2026 – **Wizz Air** is expanding its network from **Torino Airport** with four new international routes designed for the ski season. From **16 January 2027**, direct connections are taking off from **Wroclaw, Gdansk** and **Katowice** in Poland, and from **Prague** in the Czech Republic, operating every Saturday until the beginning of March and on sale from **1 July 2026**.

The new routes are part of Wizz Air's growth path in Turin, which already began with the announcement of the opening of the new operational base. The base, the company's seventh in Italy and 40th globally, will involve the placement of two aircraft at the airport of Piedmont: the first from 14 September and the second from 25 October 2026.

The new connections confirm the central role of Torino Airport for international winter tourism, facilitating access to the main ski resorts in Piedmont and the North-West Alps for European passengers. At the same time, the opening of the base will bring new national and international routes, increased capacity and an estimated employment impact of **80 direct and 700 indirect jobs**.

With the new connections from Poland and the Czech Republic, Torino Airport consolidates its position in the snow tourism markets and expands travel opportunities for local passengers. In 2026, the Wizz Air network from Turin will reach a total of **20 routes to 9 countries**.

Salvatore Gabriele Imperiale, Corporate Communications Manager of Wizz Air, said: *"The opening of the new Wizz Air base in Turin was the first step in an ambitious growth path in the Piedmontese city. Today, with the announcement of four new routes from Wroclaw, Gdansk, Katowice and Prague, we confirm a further commitment to the city and to a region that plays an increasingly important role in our expansion strategy in Italy. These new connections will help generate new inbound traffic flows from Central European markets, bringing more and more international passengers closer to the main ski resorts in Piedmont and concretely supporting the development of winter tourism in the region. Thanks in part to the growth of Turin, Wizz Air continues to strengthen its presence in Italy, offering more choice, affordable fares and new travel opportunities to Italian and European passengers. Let's WIZZ, Turin!"*

Paolo Papale, Director of Aviation Development at Torino Airport, commented: *"Wizz Air's four new ski routes strengthen Turin's position as the airport of choice for skiers from all over Europe who are interested in the variety and quality of what the mountains in Piedmont have to offer. The connections with Poland and the Czech Republic open up new opportunities to attract tourist flows to Turin, the North-West Alps and the regional snow system."*
